Entry Fee: \$180 Per Person

ELIGIBILITY: Open to current SCGA/WSCGA members. Applicants must have won: a 2024 SCGA Member Club

Championship (men's, women's, senior's), a 2024 SCGA 40+ Event (Regular, Senior, Super Senior) – field net

or gross, or a 2024 WSCGA 1-Day.

Entries must be received by 5:00 p.m. on January 15, 2025. The field will consist of 104 players. Entry fee

ENTRIES: includes tournament cart fees, club fees & range balls. Entries will be accepted based on date of entry

(first come first serve basis). Acceptance will be confirmed on the SCGA website: www.scgolf.org .

USGA rules apply, 36-hole stroke play to determine Champions in six divisions: 1) Men's Club Champion 2)

FORMAT: Men's Senior Club Champion 3) One Day Gross (Regular 40 Plus) 4) One Day Senior (Senior/Super Senior 40

Plus) 5) One Day Net (All Net Winners) 6) Women's Division (Women's Club Champion & WSCGA State One

Day).

SCHEDULE:

Players may compete in only one division.

January 24 & Prior Practice Round (player pays to the Golf Shop) – On a space available basis \$50/player.

January 25 10:00 AM Shotgun Start. Lunch provided following play. January 26 10:00 AM Shotgun Start. Awards Ceremony to follow.

A \$30.00 administration fee will be charged for all refunds until January 22nd. No refunds after January 22nd.
